Project Introduction Scholars should introduce themselves, explain the title of project, purpose, and why you chose the topic. Professionalism (The presentation should be given in a professional manner and be of high quality).	Scholar (s) conveys confidence in talking about the project, makes an eye contact with the audience frequently (almost all the time), does not stare at poster/notes more than 3 seconds at a time, and voice is clear, loud, and easy to understand. Scholar (s) avoids all distracting behaviors (i.e. pacing, saying "um" or "ah", etc.	Scholar (s) is prepared. Speaks loudly and clearly.
